

<u>Overview of Units</u> <u>EYFS</u>	
F1	<u>U/C - GOD/CREATION: Why is the word 'God' so important to Christians?</u> This unit uses persona dolls to introduce the idea that Christians believe that God created the world. There are links with harvest, and suggestions of asking a local minister about harvest and finding out what happens to all the harvest produce. There are also links with 'Messy Church'. 'Digging Deeper' goes on to include work on mini beasts, Animal Welfare Sunday, Africa (Rwanda).
F2	<u>U/C - INCARNATION: Why do Christians perform Nativity Plays at Christmas?</u> This unit explores the belief that Jesus is God in the flesh. It starts by making links between the stories about Jesus as a grown-up with the Christmas story about baby Jesus. It unpacks why Jesus is so important to Christians. There is a strong focus on Christmas. 'Digging Deeper' section goes on to look at the story of Jesus welcoming the children.
F3	<u>U/C - SALVATION: Why do Christians put a cross in an Easter Garden?</u> This explains the belief that Jesus is Saviour, using persona dolls to share the Easter story. 'Digging Deeper' includes work on the parable of the Good Samaritan. The idea of 'votive candles' is introduced and children are encouraged to visit a Cathedral or 'high' church to see them.
F4	<u>Glos Syllabus - BEING SPECIAL - Where do we belong?</u> This unit explores the idea that everyone is unique and valuable. This goes on to explain that religions believe that everyone is unique and valuable as well and that God loves people even before they are born.

F5	<u>Glos Syllabus - Which places are special and why?</u> This unit identifies places that the children find special and the reasons they find them special. It goes on to explore why the church/mosque being a special place for Christians and Muslims to go and worship God.
F6	<u>Glos Syllabus - Which stories are special and why?</u> This unit begins with asking the children about their favourite stories and why they like them. It then explores stories from different religions and why these are so special to the people who read them.
